

# **Behavior Policy**

### **Purpose**

The Behavior Policy at The Brick Farmhouse School supports the Statement of Conduct by providing clear guidelines for enforcing expectations, addressing misconduct, and fostering a positive, respectful, and safe school community. This policy ensures fair and consistent responses to behavior issues while encouraging students to take responsibility for their actions.

### Scope

This policy applies to all students enrolled at The Brick Farmhouse School and covers behavior on school grounds, during school-sponsored activities (on or off campus), and in online or virtual school environments. It also applies to off-campus or online behavior that negatively impacts the school community or its reputation.

## **Behavioral Expectations**

Students are expected to adhere to the principles outlined in the Statement of Conduct: respect, responsibility, integrity, safety, and excellence. Specific expectations include:

- Treating all individuals with kindness and respect.
- Upholding academic integrity in all work.
- Following school rules, including dress code, attendance, and technology use policies.
- Contributing to a safe and inclusive environment.
- Respecting school property and the property of others.

### **Procedures for Addressing Misconduct**

1. Reporting Misconduct:

- Any member of the school community (students, staff, parents) may report behavior concerns to a teacher or administrator.
- Reports should be made promptly, either verbally or in writing, with relevant details (e.g., date, time, location, individuals involved).
- Anonymous reports may be accepted, but follow-up may be limited without verifiable information.

#### 2. Investigation Process:

- Upon receiving a report, school staff will conduct a prompt and impartial investigation.
- The investigation may include interviews with the involved parties, witnesses, and review of relevant evidence (e.g., written communication, video footage).
- All parties will be given an opportunity to share their perspective.
- Confidentiality will be maintained to the extent possible, consistent with a thorough investigation.

#### 3. Determination:

- Administrators will determine whether a violation of the Statement of Conduct has occurred based on the investigation findings.
- Decisions will consider the severity, intent, and impact of the behavior, as well as the student's prior conduct record.

### Categories of Misconduct and Consequences

Misconduct is categorized into three levels based on severity, with corresponding consequences. The school reserves the right to adjust consequences based on specific circumstances.

#### **Level 1: Minor Infractions**

Examples: Tardiness, dress code violations, minor disruptions in class, improper use of personal devices.

#### • Consequences:

- Verbal or written warning.
- Teacher-student conference.
- Parent notification
- o Corrective actions (e.g., changing attire, writing a reflection).
- Goal: Redirect behavior and reinforce expectations.

#### Level 2: Moderate Infractions

Examples: Repeated minor infractions, disrespect toward peers or staff, cheating or plagiarism, minor vandalism, inappropriate online behavior.

#### • Consequences:

- o Parent/guardian meeting.
- Restorative actions (e.g., apology, community service).
- o Temporary loss of privileges (e.g., extracurricular activities, device use).
- Suspension at Discretion of Administration
- Goal: Address patterns of behavior and promote accountability.

#### **Level 3: Serious Infractions**

Examples: Bullying or harassment, physical aggression, theft, drug/alcohol/tobacco use or possession, weapons possession, serious academic dishonesty, threats to safety.

#### • Consequences:

- Immediate parent/guardian notification and meeting.
- Potential Expulsion at Discretion of Administration.
- Notification of law enforcement, if required by law.
- **Goal**: Ensure safety and address significant breaches of conduct.

### **Restorative Practices**

Whenever possible, The Brick Farmhouse School prioritizes restorative approaches to discipline, encouraging students to repair harm and rebuild relationships. Examples include:

- Facilitated conversations between involved parties.
- Written or verbal apologies.
- Community service or contributions to the school.
- Reflection assignments to promote self-awareness.

### **Decisions**

 The school administration and/or The Board of Directors reserve the right to suspend or revoke enrollment privileges at their discretion. Decisions to this effect are final.

### Communication with Parents/Guardians

- Parents/guardians will be notified of infractions and invited to participate in resolving the issue.
- For minor infractions, notification may occur after repeated incidents or at the teacher's discretion.
- The school encourages open dialogue and invites parents to contact teachers or administrators with concerns (Class Dojo preferred).

### **Policy Review and Updates**

This Behavior Policy is reviewed annually by the school administration to ensure it remains effective and aligned with the school's mission. Updates will be communicated to the school community.
